Message from the Board of Management

It is with great pleasure that I advise Peter McCloskey has joined the CCLO Board of Management to fill a recent vacancy. Peter comes to us with broad experience across a number of sectors, the most recent of which was his position as CEO of Delphis, an organization specializing in aged care and disability. Peter has a background in accounting and other corporate management roles and this experience will be invaluable to the Board.

Excitement is building with the imminent start to construction of our Stage 1 Supported Accommodation house at Minnamurra Road Gorokan. Everything is now ready to go and we are just waiting on official documentation from Bendigo Bank on funding for this project.

Our properties at Canton Beach Road Toukley are now fully occupied and we are obtaining quotes for the construction of a granny flat at the rear of No.9 Canton Beach Road. This will be built to platinum standard and should take around three months for completion.

CCLO is now in the unprecedented position of having a waiting list for accommodation. It seems that as soon as we acquire properties or build, we are able to find suitable occupants. On the downside, it means that there is a large number of people with disability still trying to find accommodation. To this end, we are negotiating with local affordable housing providers to see if we can lease more suitable properties to go some way towards filling this need. We are in the very early stages of looking at property in the Hunter Region, so if successful, expansion may occur in that area also.

CCLO continues to be very strong financially and this bodes well for our future sustainability. It is true to say though that we must continue to grow as it is clear that the larger financially secure organizations will be the ones to survive the uncertainties of the NDIS climate.

We recently held a very successful Strategic Planning Meeting which was attended by Board, Management Staff and senior team leaders. This was an opportunity to look at where we need to position ourselves over the next three or so years, given the huge growth in our business. At that meeting, once again, we had Keiran Turner from Bendigo Bank as a guest speaker. We enjoy a very strong business relationship with Bendigo Bank and they have been very supportive of all our expansion ventures. Jackie Finlay from the Civil Division of Legal Aid NSW also attended as a guest speaker and she was able to give us insights into the NDIS appeals process.

The Board and the Management Team all look forward to the coming year, and if the past year was anything to go by, it will be exciting and challenging.
